AMERICAN JUBILEE

A Letter to the President of the United States at a Historic Hour

Mr. President,

The Bible is a book of divine patterns. In its pages, numbers unfold not as coincidence, but as revelation. Forty days and nights of rain cleansed the earth in Noah's time; forty years in the wilderness purified Israel; forty days in the desert proved Christ's triumph over temptation. Twelve tribes formed a nation; twelve disciples birthed a Church.

Through these patterns comes meaning: forty—purification and preparation; twelve—governance and the people of God; and five—the number of grace, provision, and divine favor.

Five is the number of God's miraculous supply—the mark of His unearned blessing upon His people. The five books of the Law echo it. Five offerings were prescribed to Israel. David chose five smooth stones to slay a giant. Jesus fed five thousand men with five loaves. The four Gospels plus Acts form a New Testament Pentateuch—five volumes unveiling the grace of God in Christ. Wherever the number five appears, the Author Himself seems to step through the

story, reminding His people that He is still present, still writing, still sovereign.

And this number—five—has again stepped into history, not as myth or metaphor, but as providence unfolding before our eyes.

A Divine Pattern in America's Story

On July 4, 1826—the fiftieth Fourth of July—America celebrated its Jubilee of Independence. On that very day, two of the nation's founding pillars, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, breathed their last. The day was remembered as *America's Jubilee*.

The parallel to Leviticus 25 was unmistakable. In Scripture, every fiftieth year was a Jubilee—a year of rest, restoration, and freedom. Debts were released, families reunited, slaves set free. It was, in every sense, a celebration of God's deliverance and faithfulness.

Even the Liberty Bell bears this Jubilee truth. Commissioned in 1751—fifty years after Pennsylvania's charter—it was engraved with Leviticus 25:10: "Proclaim LIBERTY throughout all the Land unto all the Inhabitants thereof." That verse was chosen intentionally, binding the soul of America to the promise of Jubilee.

Such moments are not accidents of history; they are Divine Cameos. The God who writes the story steps briefly into

the scene to remind His people He is there.

The Fifth Jubilee
